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(75% Microdenier Acrylic/25% Bamboo):

4(4, 5) skeins

Shown in: #0004 Green Sheen

One size US I-9 (5.5 mm) crochet hook or size to

obtain gauge.

Stitch markers

Yarn needle

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### SIZES

S (M, L/1X)

### FINISHED MEASUREMENTS:

**Bust** 36 (40, 46)"/91.5 (101.5, 117) cm, including edging with wide overlap

**Length** 30 (31, 32)"/76 (78.5, 81.5) cm

### GAUGE

In Lace Pattern, 1 stitch repeat and 6 rows = 3"/7.5 cm.

In edging pattern, 8 rows = 8 1/2"/21.5 cm.

### STITCHES USED

Chain (ch), double crochet (dc), double treble crochet (dtr), single crochet (sc), slip stitch (slip st), treble crochet (tr)

### SPECIAL TERMS

**picot:** Ch 3, sl st in 3rd ch from hook.

**2-tr Cl:** Two Treble Crochet Cluster—Yarn over twice, insert hook in indicated st and draw up a loop (4 loops on hook), [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice (2 loops on hook); yarn over twice, insert hook in *same* st and draw up a loop, [yarn over and draw through 2 loops on hook] twice; yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

**Corner:** (2 tr, ch 3, 3 tr, ch 3, 3 tr, ch 3, 3 tr) in indicate stitch or space.

**tr-shell:** Treble Crochet Shell: (3 tr, ch 3, 3tr) in indicated stitch or space.

## PATTERN STITCHES

### Lace Pattern

**Row 1:** Ch 1, sc in first ch-3 sp (formed by final ch 1 and dc of previous row), ch 1, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 1, dc in same ch-3 sp] 4 times, ch 1, sk next ch-3 sp, \*sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, sk next ch-3 sp, dc in next ch-3 sp, [ch 1, dc in same ch-3 sp] 4 times, ch 1, sk next ch-3 sp; repeat from \* to last ch-sp, sc in last ch-sp, turn.

**Row 2:** Ch 4, sk first ch-1 sp, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp, [ch 2, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, \*sk next 2 ch-1 sps, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp, [ch 2, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp] 3 times; repeat from \* across, sk last ch-1 sp, tr in last st, turn.

**Row 3:** Ch 4, sc in first ch-2 sp, ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-2 sp, \*[ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp] twice, ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* across to last ch-2 sp, ch 3, sc in last ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in top of turning ch, turn.

Repeat Rows 1-3 for Lace Pattern.

## NOTES

1. Because there are an odd number of rows in the Lace Pattern repeat, the resulting fabric is reversible.
2. The back is worked from the back neck, downwards. Stitches are then worked along the opposite side of the foundation ch to begin the first and second fronts. The first and second fronts are also worked from the shoulder, downwards.
3. Edging is worked in rounds along all edges of the body, from across the lower edge, up one front edge, across back neck edge, and down opposite front edge.

## BACK

Ch 56 (66, 66).

**Foundation Row:** Sc in 6th ch from hook (beginning ch counts as ch-3 sp), ch 3, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch, \*ch 3, sk next ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from \* across to last 2 ch; ch 1, dc in last ch (final ch 1 and dc count as ch-3 sp), turn—21 (25, 25) ch-3 sps (5 (6, 6) stitch repeats).

Work in Lace Pattern until piece measures 7 1/2 (7 1/2, 9)"/19 (19, 23) cm from beg; end with a Row 1. Fasten off.

## FIRST FRONT

Working along opposite side of foundation ch of back, join yarn with sl st in first ch.

**Foundation Row:** Ch 3, sc in ch at base of next sc, ch 3, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch, \*ch 3, sk next ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from \* 2 (2, 4) more times, ch 1, sk next ch, dc in next ch, turn; leave remaining sts unworked (for back neck and second front)—9 (9, 13) ch-3 sps (2 (2, 3) stitch repeats).

Work in Lace Pattern until piece measures same as back; end with a Row 1. Fasten off.

## SECOND FRONT

Working along opposite side of foundation ch of back, sk 7 (17, 0) unworked chs (equivalent to skipping next 3 (7, 0) ch-sps) following first front. Join yarn with sl st in next (next, same) ch.

**Foundation Row:** Ch 3, sk next ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch, \*ch 3, sk next ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch; repeat from \* across, ch 1, sk next ch, dc in last ch, turn.

Work in Lace Pattern until piece measures same as back; end with a Row 1. Do not fasten off.

## JOIN BACK AND FRONTS

Place a marker at outside edge of last row of first front and second front (for edging placement).

**Next Row:** Ch 4, sk first ch-1 sp, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp, [ch 2, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, \*sk next 2 ch-1 sps, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp, [ch 2, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp] 3 times\*; repeat from \* to \* across second front, sk last ch-1 sp of second front and first ch-1 sp of back, ch 10; 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp of back, [ch 2, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, repeat from \* to \* across back, sk last ch-1 sp of back and first ch-1 sp of first front, ch 10; 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp of first front, [ch 2, 2-tr Cl in next ch-1 sp] 3 times, repeat from \* to \* across first front, sk last ch-1 sp, tr in last st, turn.

**Next Row:** Ch 4, sc in first ch-2 sp, \*ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp] twice; repeat from \* across to next ch-10 sp, ch 3, sk next 2 ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk next ch, sc in next ch, ch 3, sk last 2 ch, sk next 2-tr Cl, sc in next ch-2 sp; repeat from \* once more, \*\*ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-2 sp, [ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp] twice; repeat from \*\* to last 2 ch-2 sps, ch 3, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-2 sp, ch 1, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch, turn.

Work in Lace Pattern until piece measures 22 (23, 24)"/56 (58.5, 61) cm from beg; end with a Row 3. Do not fasten off.

## EDGING

**Round 1:** Sl st in first ch-1 sp, ch 4 (counts as tr), (2 tr, ch 3, 3 tr, ch 3, 3 tr, ch 3, 3 tr) in same ch-1 sp, \*sk next ch-3 sp, tr-shell in next ch-3 sp; repeat from \* across to last 2 ch-3 sp, sk next ch-3 sp, work Corner in last ch-3 sp; working in

ends of rows across front edge, \*\*sk 2 rows, tr-shell in end of next row (a Row 3)\*\*; repeat from \*\* to \*\* across to marker; \*\*\*sk 1 row, tr-shell in end of next 2 rows\*\*\*; repeat from \*\*\* to \*\*\* across remainder of front edge; work 2 tr-shells evenly spaced across back neck; working in ends of rows across opposite front edge, tr-shell in end of first 2 rows, repeat from \*\*\* to \*\*\* across to stitch marker; repeat from \*\* to \*\* across remainder of front edge; join with sl st in top of beginning ch. Place a marker in the center ch-3 sp of each corner. Move markers up as work progresses.

**Rounds 2 and 3:** Sl st in each st to first ch-3 sp, ch 4 (counts as tr), (2tr, ch 3, 3 tr) in same sp, tr-shell in each ch-3 sp around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

**Round 4:** Sl st in each st to first ch-3 sp, ch 4 (counts as tr), (2tr, ch 3, 3 tr) in same sp, work tr-shell in each unmarked ch-3 sp and work Corner in each marked ch-3 sp around; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

**Rounds 5 and 6:** Repeat Round 2.

**Round 7:** Sl st in each st to first ch-3 sp, ch 4 (counts as tr), 10 tr in same ch-3 sp, \*sc in sp before next tr-shell, 11 tr in next ch-3 sp; repeat from \* around; sc in space before before last tr-shell; join with sl st in top of beginning ch.

**Round 8:** Sl st in next 4 tr, ch 1, sc in same tr, sk next 5 tr, [(dtr, ch 4, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, ch 1, dtr ) in next sc] 4 times, sk next 5 tr, \*sc in next tr, sk next 5 tr, [(dtr, ch 4, sl st in 3rd ch from hook, ch 1, dtr ) in next sc] 4 times, sk next 5 tr; repeat from \* around; join with sl st in first sc. Fasten off.

## FINISHING

### Ties

Join yarn with sl st in front edge at natural waistline (or where desired for comfortable tying).


**Row 1:** Ch 5 (counts as tr), 3 tr in same space as join.

**Row 2:** Turn, sl st in first 2 tr, sl st in sp before next tr, ch 5, 3 tr in same sp.

Repeat Row 2 until tie is long enough to wrap around back and tie loosely in front (approx 30"/76cm). Fasten off.

Repeat on opposite front edge for second tie.

Using yarn needle, weave in all ends.



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
